

Jimmy Thomassie, In relation to Kitty Thomassie

Statement gathered by Lillian Lundrigan, Commission Counsel

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- 1 Upon commencing at 2:45 p.m.
- 2 Kuujjuaq, Nunavut
- 3 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Today is August 1,
- 4 2018 we are in Kuujjuaq for a statement gathering. My
- 5 name is Lillian Aglukark Lundrigan here for MMIWG.
- 6 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Jimmy Thomassie from
- 7 Kangirsuk I work for [Company]. I only work when I get
- 8 called out. (inaudible) Support worker.
- 9 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Thank you, think I
- 10 got everything.
- 11 (Off-the-record discussion omitted)
- 12 So you can start, (Inuktitut). So you can start by telling
- 13 us who it is you're talking about?
- 14 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** My little sister Kitty
- 15 Thomassie, she had lost her life on February 5.
- 16 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Okay, February 5. So
- 17 now what year?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: 2006.
- 19 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Okay. Go ahead and
- 20 tell your story.
- 21 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** I remember I was
- 22 living at [L.]'s place, a lot of people were drunk, my
- 23 grandmother had to look after [Escort], she was an escort,
- 24 poor [L.]. When the night quard was there I felt there was
- 25 something wrong, so I called my niece. I was told there was

- 1 a fight, that there was a lot of commotion going on and was
- 2 told to go check what was happening. I walked in there was
- 3 lots of blood in the living room, the stovetop was broken;
- 4 the floor was full of blood. You can see the knife on the
- 5 floor around the glass. I don't remember what I was wearing
- 6 but I could see the knife. When I walked in I didn't see
- 7 anybody. I went to the clinic at the hospital but I didn't
- 8 go to for her, I went for my sister's son, her son was
- 9 beaten. I had two kids with me, [Child 1] and [Child 2]. I
- 10 had the two kids with me. When I walked in again I finally
- 11 realized the blood was dry blood. The trail of blood was
- 12 going towards the back of the house, I followed the trail,
- 13 there was a king size bed that was put outside. I panicked,
- 14 the bed was folded, so I grabbed a hammer, used the end of
- 15 the hammer to unfold the bed. Using the hammer I touched
- 16 the body, but the body did not move. One child ran away and
- 17 the other one said, "Why is the body there?" We were both
- 18 in shock. My father taught us not to fight back when we are
- 19 attacked and that's what we were taught. Not to fight back.
- 20 I hit the body once, I didn't know what to do, I didn't
- 21 know how to react. I thought to call the police, but
- 22 someone else was already dealing with the police. Someone
- 23 else was also dealing with a different murder that same
- 24 evening. The police were dealing with two murders and the
- 25 police said to send the loved one over so the loved one can

- 1 be notified. I didn't sleep at all that night, I was
- 2 visiting here and there but I lost my sleep. There was a
- 3 reverend in Mitsirak I went to see and asked the reverend
- 4 to pray for me. I know that I will see him some day and
- 5 that day will come close, the judgement day will come and
- 6 the guy will get judged. On the court date, the guy went to
- 7 court, his mother was there. He was standing up but I could
- 8 not look at him. That's what happened to me. The guy that
- 9 killed my sister had received a life sentence. 20 years, no
- 10 parole for life. The lawyer if I wanted information one
- 11 week later, I was told about his sentence. That's what
- 12 happened to me, I did not add anything or change anything
- 13 because I don't want to keep going back to tell the story.
- 14 That's my story, and that's the story I wanted to tell.
- 15 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** And it's about your
- 16 sister?
- 17 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Yes.
- 18 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Can I ask you
- 19 questions?
- **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Yes, you may.
- 21 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Your sister was
- 22 murdered on February 5, 2006. Who was the person that
- 23 killed her?
- 24 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Samwillie Grey.
- 25 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** Samwillie...?

- 1 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Samwillie Grey. It was
- 2 in 2006, not in 2005.
- 3 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: I have 2006. Okay.
- 4 Samwillie Grey?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: Grey, yes.
- 6 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Grey. When he was
- 7 charged, what was he charged with? Manslaughter or second-
- 8 degree murder or first-degree?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: Manslaughter.
- 10 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Manslaughter?
- 11 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** That's what he was
- 12 charged with.
- 13 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Okay. How did it
- 14 happen? What was the reason?
- 15 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** He got jealous; it was
- 16 the jealousy that got to him when he was drunk, that much I
- 17 remember.
- 18 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Was that her partner
- **19** or...?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yeah, her partner, for
- 21 a long time.
- 22 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Partner like common-
- 23 law? Boyfriend, girlfriend?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yeah, yeah.
- 25 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** Okay.

- 1 JIMMY THOMASSIE: When he killed her she 2 was pregnant. 3 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Your sister? When 4 your sister was murdered? JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yeah, he stabbed her 5 6 17 times. 7 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: 17? 8 JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yeah. LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Okay. How old was 9 your sister? 10 JIMMY THOMASSIE: I think she was born 11 in '72. 12 13 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Do they have children? 14 15 JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yeah, they were taken by their fathers; one in Montreal, she had adopted 16 17 children, one lives in town in Kangirsuk, he lives with his 18 adoptive father [Father 1]. She also had an adoptive 19 daughter [Daughter 1]. 20 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** [Daughter 1]? 21 JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yes. 22 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: The whole time they
- 25 JIMMY THOMASSIE: I don't know, I've

were together, your sister with her boyfriend, was he

- 1 never noticed it before, it was never obvious and I don't
- 2 remember a lot of it before but I've never noticed him
- 3 being abusive.
- 4 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Were they drunk when
- 5 it happened? Was your sister drunk?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: Uhh.
- 7 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: I quess she didn't
- 8 drink because she was expecting a baby.
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: They were staying at
- 10 my parents'; my mother was watching. And her daughter had
- 11 also witnessed it.
- 12 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** They were watching?
- 13 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Yes, she witnessed the
- 14 beating where the leg of the table, where the metal is,
- 15 being used as a weapon. That's how he started.
- 16 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Why did he do what
- 17 he did? Simonie, Samwillie?
- 18 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Samwillie,
- 19 (unintelligible) I don't know what triggered it he must
- 20 have had a lot of anger.
- 21 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: He'll be in prison
- 22 for 20 years?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yeah, no parole for
- 24 life apparently.
- 25 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** When was he

- 1 arrested?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: He was picked up 3
- 3 days later. He was sent to AMS then was sentenced 2 years
- 4 later.
- 5 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: In 2008 he was
- 6 sentenced?
- 7 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Yeah.
- 8 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Okay. Can you spell
- 9 the name? We're going to look it up on court document. How
- 10 do you spell Samwillie's name? Samwillie?
- 11 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Samwillie.
- 12 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: S-A-M...
- 13 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** W-I-L-L-I-E.
- 14 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** E. Okay. Grey?
- **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Yeah.
- 16 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Okay. We are going
- 17 to look into court records.
- 18 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Yeah.
- 19 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: We are going to look
- 20 into the written documents from the court dates we will
- 21 also look for the sentencing documents.
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yeah.
- 23 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: That's what we are
- 24 going to look into for part of the report.
- **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Okay.

- 1 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Is that all you
- 2 wanted to say? Do you have anything else to add?
- 3 JIMMY THOMASSIE: No, what I had here
- 4 was all I wanted to say.
- 5 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Can I ask you how it
- 6 has affected your life? With you, your mother, her
- 7 daughter? How is her daughter?
- **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Her daughter [Daughter
- 9 2] was sent to her father in Montreal. They wanted her to
- 10 forget what happened. It took her a long time to forget.
- 11 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: How old was
- **12** [Daughter 2]?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: I don't remember.
- 14 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: How big was she? Was
- 15 she [uses hand to measure].
- 16 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** She was about this
- 17 height [uses hand to measure]. She was in school.
- 18 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** In kindergarten?
- 19 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Yeah, she was going to
- 20 start kindergarten.
- 21 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Do you see her?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: She left yesterday, I
- 23 pick her up. I work for the [Airline 1] so I get airline
- 24 discount so I pick her up.
- 25 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** How is she?

- 1 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** She is fine, she is
- 2 always happy to see me, she feels safe with me. I'll be
- 3 picking her up on the 17^{th} . My job is to park the planes for
- 4 [Airline 1].
- 5 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** Oh okay.
- 6 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** It's a risky job but
- 7 I'm also applying for a job with housing as a maintenance
- 8 worker. I also started working as a recreation coordinator
- 9 to help the youth, to keep them out of trouble. I had to
- 10 quit my job when I was working at [Airline 1], education
- 11 department asked me if I wanted to come back and work for
- 12 them. But right now I am just working for [Airline 2].
- 13 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** Okay.
- 14 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** For now I have a job
- 15 with them as an emergency services for [Airline 2].
- 16 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: What about your
- 17 mother? She was watching of what happened, how is your
- 18 mother?
- 19 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** She is fine, she has
- 20 now passed away on 2009.
- 21 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Did she pass away?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: It was on August 6,
- 23 2009. She was put in to a senior home, so that she will
- 24 have time to deal with her emotions. She comes back and
- 25 does not be there, goes back there.

1 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Okay. JIMMY THOMASSIE: Although she comes 2 back from Kangigsuk, she told us that she was uncomfortable 3 with the questions she was asked. And she was asked if her 4 son was taking money from us when he was angry and my 5 6 mother was shocked to hear. She told them to leave if you will ask questions. That is what she told me. 7 8 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes. 9 JIMMY THOMASSIE: She said that my son is not like that. She was trying to make them understand. I 10 do not steal from my parents or anything. 11 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes. 12 13 JIMMY THOMASSIE: Everybody could see me, I do not steal. It is not my living. 14 15 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes. JIMMY THOMASSIE: Work, safety and that 16 17 is what I do. LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes, I wonder why 18 someone would say that? What do you think about it? 19 20 JIMMY THOMASSIE: I do not really understand your question. 21 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Why do you think 22 they would say something like that to your mom? 23 JIMMY THOMASSIE: I don't know. I don't 24

understand that. I do not know why.

- 1 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: They said things
- 2 that are not true.
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yes.
- 4 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Why are they
- 5 thinking like that?
- **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Yes. What are you
- 7 doing? My son does not do that. That is what my mother
- 8 said.
- 9 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: How many more
- 10 brothers and sisters do you have?
- 11 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** There are two now, my
- 12 sister, big sister. She has two kids. But they are big now.
- 13 And I have a little sister who has four kids.
- 14 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** Okay
- **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** [Sister 1]
- 16 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** Who?
- **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** [Sister 1]
- 18 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: [Sister 1]? Okay. Do
- 19 you have any brothers? Brothers?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: The one, he has passed
- 21 on, the one, I did not mention because I do not really
- 22 remember him. He passed on having a seizure. I mean I have
- 23 lost five relatives and the fifth one was Kitty. My five
- 24 relatives all passed away. My sister Rhoda Tumasie was
- 25 injured by the brain, her head was crushed.

- 1 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes. JIMMY THOMASSIE: My mother was sick 2 here. My father was sick in Kangigsuk. 3 4 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Okay 5 JIMMY THOMASSIE: And Kitty was 6 murdered. LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Kitty. 7 JIMMY THOMASSIE: It is that way. 8 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Do you have proper support in Nunavut? Mental health worker? 9 10 JIMMY THOMASSIE: I am not using that myself; that I want to forget. I have tried to play sports. 11 Like jogging, water ball, floor hockey. I am not an ice 12 hockey player. I like going outdoors. I am a hunter but I 13 do not have hunting equipment although I am a hunter. 14 15 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes. If you wanted help in your community, is there someone there to help? Is 16 17 there something? JIMMY THOMASSIE: I am not aware of 18 anything like that but when you are asking questions, this 19 is my first time. 20 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes. Okay. 21 22 JIMMY THOMASSIE: This is my first time. It's okay. I have never been asked any kind of questions 23 24 before but when they were making a statement, to see if
- 25 they are correct and having to accept it.

- 1 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes.
- 2 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** That is the only one.
- 3 Now, try to see that this is the first time I have ever
- 4 been interviewed.
- 5 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes. Trying to get
- 6 help, there will be some help from here, from the inquiry
- 7 and working with them, would you use it? For support?
- **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** For me, I want to help
- 9 in being supportive.
- 10 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes.
- 11 JIMMY THOMASSIE: How can I say this? I
- 12 want to help and support. Just tell my fellow people in a
- 13 good way. If you do this, just stay where you are. If you
- 14 are doing this, you will be comfortable. I want to tell
- 15 them in a good way.
- 16 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes.
- 17 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** I was like that. I was
- 18 a gym teacher after that because I didn't want kids to get
- 19 involved. They are too (inaudible), although they are
- 20 playing and lose a game. Just keep them all the same.
- 21 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes.
- 22 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** My job was a gym
- 23 teacher
- 24 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes. How is it? Is
- 25 it continuing? Are you still continuing?

- 1 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Right now I have moved
- 2 to (inaudible).
- 3 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes. Although you
- 4 don't want to help them, are you just helping them?
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yes. If you stop now
- 6 asking questions.
- 7 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Do you want to stop?
- **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** What?
- 9 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Do you want to stop?
- 10 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Yes. I am tired.
- 11 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Your sister Kitty.
- 12 Your sister who was Kitty Thomassie. Her boyfriend was
- 13 Samwillie Grey. Their names, if their name is written the
- 14 correct way.
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yes.
- 16 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: If you do not have
- 17 any questions, if I can talk to you about the
- 18 recommendation, it would be your recommendations. It would
- 19 be assessed and how it would be forward to the inquiry. The
- 20 commissioners want to hear what people have to say. What
- 21 would be your recommendation and how it can be corrected
- 22 about Inuit? They go through it and they are a lot of them.
- 23 The people who have been asked questions.
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: I have been to another
- 25 community. I went to Inukjuak when they were learning how

- 1 to hunt. If it was certainly like that, I would attend one,
- 2 and if I was asked, I would say yes. The event was in
- 3 Montreal.
- 4 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes.
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: If there is any, I
- 6 could attend. It would be okay for a visit. And I would
- 7 talk the same way.
- 8 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes.
- 9 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** I think it would help
- 10 if, on this one, if there was one like that, I would attend
- 11 and I don't mind.
- 12 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Your sister was
- 13 murdered; how or what, what, what's your message? With
- 14 respect to your sister's murder and what happened to her?
- 15 To people, how do you want them to understand? Your
- 16 feeling, what you went through? Is that your message?
- 17 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** My father told me
- 18 before that this person is killed, the person is killed.
- 19 The person who did it, and if I see this. I would not kill
- 20 the person. The person will not come back. The person who
- 21 is killed will not come back. I am not responsible. Because
- 22 he will be taken care of by somebody else. This is what I
- 23 am saying. I would not want to be taken, even by the
- 24 police, by the courts. He would not give back if I take
- 25 him.

LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Okay, like revenge? 1 JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yes 2 3 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: This revenge. JIMMY THOMASSIE: It's nothing. 4 5 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: We are not allowed 6 to use it. Okay. 7 JIMMY THOMASSIE: For example, a baby does this and forgets. That is the way we have to do it 8 9 too. 10 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes. Okay. JIMMY THOMASSIE: They forget, they want 11 to hold something and they forget. They go to other things. 12 That is how we are supposed to do it too. 13 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Okay. I understand. 14 15 One more question. JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yes. 16 17 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: How would you use about the healing? For healing? What would you suggest as 18 for people to heal from? The ones that are beaten up. Their 19 children being murdered. There are a lot of people who are 20 hurting inside them. How would you suggest for them to 21 heal? How would you suggest they...? 22 23 JIMMY THOMASSIE: Going forward. And 24 trying to get your life back. From going to places like

going to church every week. By doing that, it is also a

- 1 healing process.
- 2 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes.
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: By going to church,
- 4 you're able to start healing. If you say that you want to
- 5 do this, the church is the only place that you can use.
- 6 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes.
- 7 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Although you think
- 8 that it's not useful, it is the place to be.
- 9 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes.
- 10 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** I have tried healing
- 11 and the church was the only place to go.
- 12 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** Okay. If you want to
- 13 add more, you can add some more if you want.
- 14 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** No.
- 15 **LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN:** If want to finish up
- 16 or if you want to write the emotions you have. If you want
- 17 to write, you can give it to us and we can put your writing
- 18 to the statement.
- 19 **JIMMY THOMASSIE:** Yes.
- 20 LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: If you feel you want
- 21 to share some more by writing. You can write and we can
- 22 take it and add it to the statement. It's up to you.
- JIMMY THOMASSIE: Okay, I just want to
- 24 know if I will be alright and I was not prepared but I
- 25 wanted to work on the statement.

1	LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Well, you just came
2	in too, so the next few hours, when you are here, if you
3	wanted to write and give them to me and we will put it in
4	the statement. It is up to you.
5	JIMMY THOMASSIE: Maybe tomorrow morning
6	when I am calm.
7	LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes. Absolutely.
8	JIMMY THOMASSIE: And when I am rested
9	and have eaten breakfast, it is better that way.
10	LILLIAN LUNDRIGAN: Yes, it is
11	understandable. So, we can finish up now.
12	JIMMY THOMASSIE: Yes.
