1 [FEBRUARY 6, 2018, 9:24 A.M.] FRANCINE MERASTY: All right. We're on the record. 2 3 The date is February 6, 2018. It's 9:24, and we're in Prince George. This is Francine Merasty with 4 5 the National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls speaking on the record with 6 7 Karissa Joseph - and her other name is Carson - and Nina Marie Joseph. And they're from the Yekooche 8 9 First Nation and they've travelled here from ... 10 Where did you travel here from? 11 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Burns Lake. 12 FRANCINE MERASTY: Where? Burns Lake? Okay. 13 And you? 14 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: I live here. 15 FRANCINE MERASTY: We're here in Prince George. And I've 16 stated the date already. 17 Karissa Joseph, also known as Carson, you're here 18 to voluntarily give your statement in the matter of 19 your mother, Bonnie Joseph, who went missing October 20 2007. 21 And present with us also in the room are ...? JONI CONLON: Joni Conlon, quardianship worker with Carrier 22 23 Sekani Family Services. DENISE McKINLEY: Denise McKinley, mental health 24 clinician with Carrier Sekani Family Services. 25

1	FRANCINE MERASTY: Okay. Your statement will be audio
2	recorded today and you have also allowed us to
3	videotape your statement. Can you please confirm that
4	you agree with this?
5	KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: We agree.
6	FRANCINE MERASTY: Okay. And also as the legal guardian,
7	you're?
8	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I'm consenting, yeah.
9	FRANCINE MERASTY: Okay. And, Nina Marie Joseph, you're
10	present with us in the room. Your statement will be
11	audio recorded today and you've allowed us to
12	videotape your statement. Can you please confirm that
13	you agree with this?
14	NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Yes, I agree.
15	FRANCINE MERASTY: Okay. So who wants to make their
16	statement first?
17	NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Not me.
18	FRANCINE MERASTY: Okay. You can start talking, Carson.
19	You can begin anywhere.
20	KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: I just wish I knew my mom.
21	FRANCINE MERASTY: How old were you when your mother went
22	missing?
23	KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: It was in 2007 and I was seven.
24	FRANCINE MERASTY: Okay. And where did she go missing?
25	Like

1 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: On the Highway of Tears. 2 FRANCINE MERASTY: Okay. 3 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: I don't know. All I know is that 4 my mom told me that she was trying to get to 5 Burns Lake for [S.]'s birthday and she was 6 hitchhiking and she never showed up. That's what I've 7 been told. 8 FRANCINE MERASTY: Mm-hm. Can you tell us a little bit 9 about what you know about your mother. Like, how she 10 was as a person? 11 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: I don't remember much of her. 12 FRANCINE MERASTY: Okay. So where was she living at the 13 time this happened? 14 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Prince. 15 FRANCINE MERASTY: Prince George? 16 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: (Moves head up and down). 17 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: (unintelligible) 18 FRANCINE MERASTY: And you guys were living all together? 19 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: At the time we were in a different 20 foster home than we -- than the one she's in right 21 now. 22 FRANCINE MERASTY: Oh, okay. 23 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: We're with the Ministry now. Carrier 24 Sekani at the time. FRANCINE MERASTY: Okay. Well, we can let your sister talk 25

 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: (Moves head up and down) FRANCINE MERASTY: So you can begin sharing. Like, we don't really have a script. It's what the person wants to share with the Inquiry. NINA MARIE JOSEPH: (unintelligible) I don't remember anything much about our mom. I don't know what to say. I just remember, like, when we were younger, we we all we all had to do, like, a whole bunch of DNA tests and stuff 'cause they found, like, stuff of our mom and yeah. Other than that, I don't remember much about her. FRANCINE MERASTY: How old were you when your mom went missing? NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Uh I think nine. Eight or nine. I don't know. I'm two years older than you; right? KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: (Moves head up and down) NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Yeah. FRANCINE MERASTY: And you said you were in foster care? NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Yes, with Karissa and [V.] before. Till I was at age 11. And then we moved in well, we switched from the Ministry to Carrier Sekani so that we could live with our little sister, [S.]. 	1	if you're nervous or shy.

FRANCINE MERASTY: How many kids did your mom have? 1 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Five. 'Cause there's [B.], there's 2 3 me, there's Karissa, and [V.], and [S.]. 4 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: (unintelligible) 5 FRANCINE MERASTY: And how long were you guys in care 6 before your mom went missing? 7 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: That I couldn't tell you, 'cause I 8 don't know when -- what age we went into care -- or I 9 did. 10 FRANCINE MERASTY: Were you younger or ...? 11 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: I don't -- I remember the first day, 12 like, going to the foster -- or, yeah, the foster home 13 in Prince George when I was younger. But I don't know 14 age. All I remember is I was young. 15 FRANCINE MERASTY: And who told you about your mother when 16 she went missing? 17 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Hmm ... maybe the Ministry? I don't 18 know. Maybe our worker. I don't know. I don't 19 remember. 20 FRANCINE MERASTY: Do you --21 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Or I -- or I don't think we got told 22 for a while. Like, we didn't get told, like, right 23 away, like, when she got -- went missing. 24 FRANCINE MERASTY: Mm-hm. 25 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: I think it wasn't until, like, we were

1 older they told us. Yeah. 2 FRANCINE MERASTY: And how did you feel about it? 3 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Well, I was young. I didn't really ... 4 I don't want to, like, sound mean or anything, but I 5 didn't have, like, really any feelings, 'cause I didn't really know her. So ... I mean, like, even 6 7 now -- I mean, I miss her and stuff, but I just didn't know her enough to ... I don't know. 8 9 But I'm here for my dad though, because he's 10 still struggling with Mom being missing, you know. 11 FRANCINE MERASTY: Do you want to tell us about that? 12 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: My dad? 13 FRANCINE MERASTY: Yeah. 14 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Well ... 15 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: [One line redacted - personal 16 information]. 17 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: No. [One line redacted - personal 18 information]. 19 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: 'Til he starts drinking again. 20 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: [One line redacted - personal information]. 21 And also he's been drinking still. I'm still mad 22 about that, but ... 23 Our dad has, like, a drinking problem. Ever --24 like, 'cause of being in residential school. And then 25 it got, like, worse when our mom went missing. [Five

1 lines redacted - personal information]. He's still in 2 pain though, but he's still drinking. 3 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: That's his fault. 4 FRANCINE MERASTY: So what residential school did your dad 5 go to? Do you know? 6 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: [Indian Residential School 1]. 7 FRANCINE MERASTY: Oh, okay. And how long was he there? NINA MARIE JOSEPH: That I don't know. That's all he told 8 9 me was that he went to [Indian Residential School 1], 10 him and Mom. 11 FRANCINE MERASTY: Do you know the reason why you guys got 12 put into foster care? 13 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: I sort of have an idea 'cause, like, I 14 got this letter from the government or whatever, like, 15 when I aged out of, like, the many reasons why we were 16 in care -- or got put into care. FRANCINE MERASTY: Mm-hm. Do you want to talk about that? 17 18 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Kind of. But I kind of don't 'cause 19 it's, like, harsh. [One line redacted - confidential information]. Well, I -- I don't know 20 21 what he did to my -- like, Carson or [V.], [S.] or 22 [B.], but I know what he did to me. And getting that letter was, like, hard. 23 24 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Mom told me that when Dad -- when he said that Dad beat her, Mom told me that wasn't 25

She said 5 that only [G.] did that. 6 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: She lied. I can give Mom the letter 7 and she can read it herself. [Nine lines redacted - confidential 8 9 information]. 10 FRANCINE MERASTY: So during this time, like, she was 11 reported missing, is that still ongoing? Like, it's 12 an open case? 13 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Well, ever since, like, we, like, 14 started doing, like, DNA tests -- like, we had, like, 15 a certain detective and his name was Tom. 16 FRANCINE MERASTY: Mm-hm. 17 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: And when I had a phone, I would get 18 into contact with him every month. But, like, 19 because, like, I don't have a phone, I don't really 20 have any way of contacting him, so I haven't contacted 21 him in about a year now. 22 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: I contacted him. 23 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Like, I would always contact him to 24 see -- get any updates or if he found anything. But 25 usually when I'd ask him that, there was, like,

KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: I still have his number in my 2 3 phone. 4 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Hmm? 5 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: I never deleted the number. 6 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: It might have changed. I don't know. 7 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Oh. NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Like, his number. I mean, you could 8 9 try testing it. 10 FRANCINE MERASTY: So have you received counselling in 11 regards to your missing mother? 12 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Yeah, I did. But it didn't, like, 13 really help. So, like ... I don't know. I guess I 14 went down my dad's path and I started drinking. And I 15 was, like, drinking, like, heavily and everybody got 16 worried about me. So I went to treatment last year 17 for four months, and that really helped. I went to 18 (unintelligible) Canyon. 19 FRANCINE MERASTY: That's good. 20 So who's the oldest in your family? 21 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: That would be my older brother, 22 [B.]. 23 FRANCINE MERASTY: Oh, okay. 24 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: He's 22. 25 FRANCINE MERASTY: And what is he up to?

1 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Well, he's in Prince now. We're going to see him later. We're going to visit him. 'Cause 2 3 we -- well, they rarely get to visit him. 4 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: He's always busy. 5 FRANCINE MERASTY: We'll just take a break. Okay? All 6 right. So it's 9:39 a.m. and we're going to take a 7 break. [PROCEEDINGS ADJOURNED AT 9:39 A.M.] 8 9 [PROCEEDINGS RESUMED AT 10:14 A.M.] FRANCINE MERASTY: All right. We're back on the record 10 11 here in Prince George. It's 10:14 a.m., February 6. 12 And did you want to add something else, Carson, 13 to what we've been discussing? 14 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: I'm pissed off because the 15 investigators aren't -- I feel like they're not doing 16 a very good job in looking for her. I feel like they 17 just stopped because they forgot or something. 18 FRANCINE MERASTY: Mm-hm. 19 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Yeah, I'm just pissed off 'cause 20 they don't -- they don't keep us in the loop. They 21 don't really talk to us any more. Well, they never 22 really talked to us. And I'm just pissed about that. NINA MARIE JOSEPH: But they're, like -- you got to 23 24 remember there's, like, missing women. Like, not just 25 native or First Nations, but everybody. That they're

NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Well, our, like, detective's from 5 Prince George. Like, he lives here. 6 7 FRANCINE MERASTY: Do you know his name? NINA MARIE JOSEPH: His name is Tom. 8 9 FRANCINE MERASTY: Tom ...? NINA MARIE JOSEPH: I don't know his last name. 10 11 FRANCINE MERASTY: Oh, okay. And you've been in contact --12 like, he's been working on this case for how long? 13 Like, since it started or ... 14 NTNA MARIE JOSEPH: Yeah. 15 FRANCINE MERASTY: And then he updates you every - every 16 month, you said? Until about a year ago. 17 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: A year or two ago. I think two years. 18 FRANCINE MERASTY: Oh, okay. So a -- what's a 19 recommendation you would make? Like, you said they --20 they don't contact you on a -- on a regular basis. So 21 you're saying that --22 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: I want more information. Like, 23 when they get it, they just contact us right away. 24 FRANCINE MERASTY: Yeah. Well, that's good to know. Thank 25 you for sharing that. Yeah.

1	I know on the way here that you talked to your
2	social worker. Like, you were more open with her
3	'cause you feel more comfortable with her. Do you
4	want to share some of the things that you talked about
5	with her?
6	KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: I just said that I missed her and
7	I wish that she was there for us when we were kids and
8	that she was still with us.
9	FRANCINE MERASTY: Mm-hm. Yeah. Let's see.
10	(unintelligible)
11	KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: (unintelligible)
12	NINA MARIE JOSEPH: (unintelligible) family.
13	KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: (unintelligible)
14	NINA MARIE JOSEPH: She wanted you to say that. That's why
15	she showed you.
16	KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: I just want to know more of our
17	family too. Like, we don't have that much contact
18	with our family.
19	FRANCINE MERASTY: Like, your brothers and sisters? Or
20	your extended family, like your aunts and uncles?
21	NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Extended.
22	KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Extended.
23	FRANCINE MERASTY: You've never had that or what?
24	KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: I mean, we go to Yekooche, like,
25	every year for that Christmas in July thing. But

1 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Whenever we can.

2 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Yeah, whenever we can. 3 But sometimes we get there late and then it's 4 over, and then sometimes we're just too busy to go. NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Or because of the weather. 5 6 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Yeah, the weather. 7 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: I remember one time we got stuck. 8 Like, that was the day that (unintelligible) 9 throwing-up flu. 'Cause he ate candies for breakfast. 10 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: That was me. 11 FRANCINE MERASTY: Do you know any --12 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: (unintelligible) FRANCINE MERASTY: Do you know any of your aunts and 13 14 uncles? Like, their names? 15 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: No. I don't. 16 FRANCINE MERASTY: So you don't know your --17 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Well, I know --18 FRANCINE MERASTY: -- your mother's siblings? 19 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: I know Aunty Dora and Aunty Sharon. 20 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Darlene. 21 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Oh, yeah, and Darlene. 22 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Don't we have an uncle in 23 England? 24 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Yeah. 25 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: I don't know his name.

1 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: His name is Dan.

2 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Yeah. We have one uncle. I used 3 to talk to him every day, but I got rid of Facebook 4 and he hasn't talked that much any more. I asked him 5 if I could visit him. He's just, like, "Sure, if you 6 get on a plane." I was just like, "Oh, where do you 7 live?" He's just, like, "England." I was just, like, "Oh." 8 9 FRANCINE MERASTY: So what brought you here today? Why did 10 you want to come share with the National Inquiry? 11 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: To honour our mom. 12 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: I came here to support her. 13 FRANCINE MERASTY: How would -- how would, like, Canada --14 what would you say to Canada or to the government to 15 make things better for people that have lost loved 16 ones, like, through them going missing or murdered? 17 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: What was the question? 18 FRANCINE MERASTY: How do you think things could be better? 19 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: I don't know. FRANCINE MERASTY: Okay. Do you feel that you've been 20 21 heard? Like, did you get what you needed to get out of coming here and sharing? 22 23 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: (Moves head up and down) 24 FRANCINE MERASTY: Yeah? 25 You?

1 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Sort of. I was, like -- I had 2 different feelings from Karissa and [V.] and all 3 them. 4 FRANCINE MERASTY: Do you want to talk about that? 5 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: Oh, I don't know. Like, my -- like, 6 all my siblings, like, miss her and stuff. That 7 they -- I ... I don't know. I don't know how to word it. It's just, like ... I do miss her. It's just, 8 9 like, I just didn't know her well enough to, like, miss her that much. So I have, like, different 10 11 feelings than Karissa and (unintelligible). So ... 12 yeah. 13 FRANCINE MERASTY: Well, I guess that's -- if you guys 14 have -- if you don't have anything else to add, we'll 15 close. 16 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: (unintelligible) them about the park? KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Oh, yeah. I only have one 17 18 memory, but it's kind of about our dad. But the only 19 memory I have is me and Nina were at Fort George Park 20 and --21 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: And [V.]. 22 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Hmm? NINA MARIE JOSEPH: And [V.]. That was the day that --23 you know that picture that we have of, like, the whole 24 25 family? It was that day.

1 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Oh.

2 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: (unintelligible)

KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: We have the picture of our mom
and dad and then all of us. And then I remember ... I
guess this is why I'm scared of heights, but -- 'cause
I got scared. But our dad -- we were on the swings
and our dad pushed us and he pushed us so high that
our -- the tip of our toes could actually touch one of
the trees.

10 FRANCINE MERASTY: Mm-hm.

11 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: And I guess that's why I've been 12 scared of heights. But -- I don't know. We -- that's

13 the only memory I actually have of them.

14 FRANCINE MERASTY: Wow. How old were you?

15 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: Young. I don't remember.

16 FRANCINE MERASTY: Yeah.

17 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: I think that was the last time we saw

18 Mom, too.

19 FRANCINE MERASTY: All right. Well, we'll close if there's 20 nothing more to say.

21 KARISSA (CARSON) JOSEPH: (Moves head up and down)

22 NINA MARIE JOSEPH: (Moves head up and down)

23 FRANCINE MERASTY: Yeah?

All right. The time is 10:23 a.m., February 6 in Prince George, and we're closing.
