 --- Upon commencing on Thursday, October 18, 2018 at 6:56
 p.m.

KERRIE REAY: Ok then, [Sister 1], for the 4 5 record this is Kerrie Reay, statement taker for the National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women 6 7 and Girls. And today is October the 18th of 2018 and we are at St. John's, Newfoundland at the Sheraton Hotel. Today 8 with me is [Sister 1]. And along today for support in the 9 room is [Sister 1]'s sister, [Sister 2]. For the record, 10 [Sister 1] would like to be referred to as [abbreviated 11 form of Sister 1's name]. And [Sister 1] is here today to 12 speak of her survivorship. And [Sister 1] has decided today 13 14 to only have audio and is not going to have the video recording. [Sister 1], the space is yours, the time is 15 yours; when you're ready to start. Some people like to 16 start with where they're from and growing up and others 17 want to start right with the trauma and so it's your time 18 here, ok? When you're ready. 19

20 [SISTER 1]: I don't know how to start off -21 KERRIE REAY: You can talk about your family 22 and where you're from and --

23 [SISTER 1]: (Crying) I don't know how to
24 start it.

KERRIE REAY: You said you were born on

1 [birthdate] 1992 and where were you born, [Sister 1]? 2 [SISTER 1]: Born in [Newfoundland-and-Labrador Community 1]. 3 **KERRIE REAY:** [Poses a factual question 4 5 about the community]? 6 [SISTER 1]: Yup. 7 KERRIE REAY: And your mom and your dad, and your family? 8 [SISTER 1]: My mom and dad is from 9 [Newfoundland-and-Labrador Community 2]. 10 11 **KERRIE REAY:** [Newfoundland-and-Labrador Community 2], ok. 12 [SISTER 1]: (Inaudible reply). 13 14 **KERRIE REAY:** I know you have a sister, [Sister 2], here. 15 [SISTER 1]: (Crying). I don't know if I can 16 17 do it. KERRIE REAY: I'm going to suggest that we 18 stop the tape so that you can take a deep breath and settle 19 20 down and maybe walk around the room. It's 6:59. That's ok, 21 you just take your time. 22 (Short break) KERRIE REAY: It's now six - 7:02. 23 [SISTER 1]: We went to those in the 24 25 afternoon. We went up to get beer and liquor. When we got

1 home we were drinking.

2 KERRIE REAY: Who was there? Who was with
3 you?
4 [SISTER 1]: Me, [Man 1], and [Woman 2].

5 KERRIE REAY: Okay. You were having a few
6 drinks?

7 [SISTER 1]: I had a few beer and I started drinking liquor. And I blacked out. I woke up in the 8 hospital. And I asked my mom -- my mom was sleeping there. 9 And I woke her up and I asked her how come I'm in there. 10 She said that I got picked up by the ambulance. I was 11 losing a lot of blood. One of the RCMP officers, they said 12 -- she said it took a while for her to wake me up. I was 13 14 laying my own pool of blood. The bed was covered in bed and I was on the floor in my own pool of blood. 15

The RCMP officer told me a few times that 16 17 I'm lucky to be alive. I was in the -- in the hospital in [Newfoundland-and-Labrador Community 1] for two days and 18 they said I had to get Medevacked to here in St. John's. 19 Ι 20 had, like, two surgeries -- two surgeries I think. I've been here in a hospital in a private room for two weeks. 21 22 They sent me back to home to [Newfoundland-and-Labrador Community 1]. 23

24 KERRIE REAY: When you went back to
25 [Newfoundland-and-Labrador Community 1], did you go back

1 into the -- the hospital? 2 [SISTER 1]: I had to get another surgery in another three months time. After my surgery, I stayed in 3 the hospital for, like, two days. And then everything was 4 5 good after that. **KERRIE REAY:** And when did this happen? 6 7 [SISTER 1]: [Specific date] is when I woke up in the hospital, 2017. 8 KERRIE REAY: So it's -- it's been [number 9 redacted] long months? 10 11 [SISTER 1]: Yeah. KERRIE REAY: And how are you doing now 12 physically? Are you healed from your -- your -- from what 13 14 happened? [SISTER 1]: I got quite a big scar on my 15 belly from surgery. I don't know, I just can't get the 16 17 thought out of my head of just being alive today. KERRIE REAY: Yeah. 18 [SISTER 1]: I'm so happy I survived it. 19 20 KERRIE REAY: Yes. Can you share with the 21 Commissioners what happened? Do you know what happened? 22 [SISTER 1]: They are thinking that he stuck a beer bottle ---23 **KERRIE REAY:** Broken beer bottle? 24 25 [SISTER 1]: I don't think it was open

because they couldn't find any broken bottles in the house. 1 2 But I had to get a surgery and get stitches done up there for the -- for it to stop bleeding. 3 **KERRIE REAY:** On the inside? 4 5 [SISTER 1]: That's what they think is it's from a beer bottle. 6 7 KERRIE REAY: And this was the fellow that was with you? 8 [SISTER 1]: Yeah. They told me he's only 9 in the correctional centre for another three years. 10 11 **KERRIE REAY:** So it went to trial? [SISTER 1]: He got three years and then 12 he's out. 13 14 KERRIE REAY: Did he plead guilty or did he plead not guilty? 15 [SISTER 1]: I think he plead guilty. 16 17 KERRIE REAY: Okay. And so he -- you said 18 he'll be out in three years? [SISTER 1]: Yeah. 19 20 KERRIE REAY: So he didn't get very much 21 time then. 22 [SISTER 1]: I was hoping it'd be longer than three years. It was hard to go through but just glad 23 I made it through. 24 KERRIE REAY: Yes. Yes, I'm glad you made 25

it through too. Your family, your friends. So that's 1 pretty -- that's -- that's pretty significant. You're --2 you're young. 3 [SISTER 1]: Yeah. 4 5 **KERRIE REAY:** So what would you like to share with the Commission? What your thoughts are about 6 7 the sentence he received? [SISTER 1]: I don't like that he only got 8 three years. Like, it just hard, like -- if he goes back 9 to [Community 3] (phonetic) I was down there quite a bit. 10 And if I sees him, I'm probably going to have a bad anxiety 11 12 attack. **KERRIE REAY:** So you're already worrying 13 14 about him getting out. [SISTER 1]: Yeah. 15 KERRIE REAY: And when the matter was in 16 court, was there anybody from Victim Services that came and 17 spoke to you, or ---18 [SISTER 1]: I was ---19 20 **KERRIE REAY:** --- supported you? [SISTER 1]: I was talking to them before I 21 went and made a statement in court. 22 KERRIE REAY: Okay. 23 24 [SISTER 1]: It's in -- they're in the same building as court and ---25

KERRIE REAY: Okay. 1 2 [SISTER 1]: --- I went to talk to them before court was going on. 3 **KERRIE REAY:** Right. Were they helpful? 4 5 [SISTER 1]: I don't remember what they were telling me but ---6 KERRIE REAY: A little overwhelming with 7 8 everything that was happening? [SISTER 1]: Yeah. 9 KERRIE REAY: And how about the police? How 10 were they with you? Were they helpful? 11 [SISTER 1]: They just told me what -- what 12 the scene was like when they arrived and they said I'm 13 14 lucky to be alive. KERRIE REAY: And when they talked to you, 15 [Sister 1], was there anybody else in the room with you to 16 17 be supportive hearing that information? Must have been pretty traumatic for you to hear that. 18 [SISTER 1]: They told me over the phone 19 20 first but I seen them, like, last -- last week some time. 21 They said it was a horrific scene and it wasn't easy to 22 watch. KERRIE REAY: So they talked to you about 23 24 your statement over the telephone? [SISTER 1]: Or, I called them before I came 25

here. And I was asking them some questions about what 1 2 happened that night. They said it was a horrific scene. KERRIE REAY: When they -- when they came to 3 the hospital -- when you -- when you were first talking, 4 you said about the lady constable, when she came to see you 5 in the hospital. 6 7 [SISTER 1]: Or, I don't think it was her who came to the hospital. 8 KERRIE REAY: Okay. 9 [SISTER 1]: But I was talking to her last 10 week. Or, she's the one that came over that night before 11 the ambulance did. 12 **KERRIE REAY:** Okay. Do you have much memory 13 14 of your time in the hospital or here in St. John's? [SISTER 1]: I was just mostly in bed and it 15 was hard to get out of bed. 16 17 **KERRIE REAY:** M'hmm. Yeah. [SISTER 1]: And I went to the cafeteria, I 18 had to be in a wheelchair. 19 20 KERRIE REAY: And coming from [Newfoundlandand-Labrador Community 1], it's quite a ways to come. Were 21 22 you able to have family here? [SISTER 1]: My mom stayed with me the two 23 weeks I was here. 24 KERRIE REAY: Okay. Did -- did she stay in 25

1	the hospital room with you? Or did she
2	[SISTER 1]: Yeah.
3	KERRIE REAY: Okay. So she didn't have to
4	get a hotel.
5	[SISTER 1]: No.
6	KERRIE REAY: Well, that's good.
7	[SISTER 1]: We were in a private room.
8	KERRIE REAY: Okay. Well, that's good.
9	That's good. Thinking about when you were coming here and
10	you were doing lots of thinking, is there something you
11	really wanted the Commissioners to know about what
12	happened? Anything that if you were angry about
13	anything? Was there anything that you really wanted them
14	to know?
15	[SISTER 1]: Just the story I just told.
16	KERRIE REAY: And that the man that did it -
17	- the guy that did it to you only received three years?
18	[SISTER 1]: He's been in there since
19	[month] since it happened.
20	KERRIE REAY: Okay.
21	[SISTER 1]: And he only has another three
22	years to go.
23	KERRIE REAY: And so he's just really
24	started and you're worried already about him being released
25	with such a short time.

[SISTER 1]: I spend most of my town in the 1 2 town where he lives. That's why I'm worried. 3 KERRIE REAY: And have you had any support? Like, have you had any support to help deal with the trauma 4 5 that you've -- that you've had to deal with? Any support? Any counselling? You've been on your own? 6 7 [SISTER 1]: Yeah. 8 **KERRIE REAY:** Victim Services didn't have anything after the court for you? 9 [SISTER 1]: No. 10 11 **KERRIE REAY:** Did they talk to you about any programs that were available for you? 12 13 [SISTER 1]: No. KERRIE REAY: I sense you're feeling alone. 14 [SISTER 1]: Sometimes it feels like that, 15 16 yeah. 17 **KERRIE REAY:** And when you're feeling like that, what sort of things do you do for yourself? 18 [SISTER 1]: Nothing. I just drink. 19 20 **KERRIE REAY:** Does that happen very often? 21 [SISTER 1]: I drink probably like every 22 day. KERRIE REAY: You're so young to have such a 23 burden. Do you have hope? 24 25 [SISTER 1]: Not really.

KERRIE REAY: You know, that's something 1 2 that Michelle can help you with. The Inquiry can help you get what you need. This is -- this is -- this type of 3 trauma is -- it's horrific. And it's hard to -- it's hard 4 5 for -- for anyone to deal with trauma. But this is -- this is really -- this is really horrific. And we certainly 6 don't want you to be trying to deal with it on your own. 7 It's important to have support to help you through the day. 8 Would that be helpful, do you think, if you had some 9 support? 10 11 [SISTER 1]: I think I'll manage. KERRIE REAY: Are you concerned that 12 [Newfoundland-and-Labrador Community 1] too small? 13 14 [SISTER 1]: No. **KERRIE REAY:** Is there anything else you'd 15 like to share with the Commissioners, with the Inquiry? I 16 17 can -- I can see it's really difficult for you. Okay. Would you like us to stop? 18 [SISTER 1]: Yeah. 19 20 KERRIE REAY: Okay. 7:20. I'm just going to 21 turn this off for a minute and then we can talk again about 22 what you'd like to do next. And then we'll come back and do the consent. 23 Okay. It is 7:22 and we're back on the 24 25 record with [Sister 1]. And, [Sister 1], we were -- we

talked at the beginning of the statement about whether or 1 2 not you would like your matter to be public or to be private. 3 [SISTER 1]: M'hmm. 4 KERRIE REAY: And from -- from what you've 5 6 shared today -- and I know it's been so hard for you to 7 share. But it is -- it is the beginning of a journey for 8 you. A healing journey. And the person that did this to you has gone to jail. 9 [SISTER 1]: Yeah. 10 11 KERRIE REAY: And how are you feeling about whether you would like your statement to be public or 12 private? 13 14 [SISTER 1]: Public. KERRIE REAY: Public. Okay. So you know 15 that it'll be posted on the -- the website -- your 16 17 transcript that you've sent today. [SISTER 1]: Yeah. 18 KERRIE REAY: Okay. Any last words? 19 20 [SISTER 1]: No. KERRIE REAY: Okay. Well, [Sister 1], you 21 did really well. Incredibly well for -- for sharing your 22 truth today. Okay. I'll turn it off at 7:23. 23 24 --- Upon adjourning at 7:23. 25
