

2	Upon commencing on Tuesday, October 17, 2017 at 11:52
3	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: So, this is Marie
4	Audrey with the National Inquiry. We are in Winnipeg on
5	October 17, and it is 11:52. I am today with
6	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Dorothy Starr.
7	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Stephanie Starr.
8	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Jennifer Guimond.
9	MS. LISA HARTWICK: And, Lisa Hartwick.
10	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Well, thank you,
11	again, for coming with us. Just to put on the record, you
12	were with us yesterday, you gave your statement yesterday,
13	and you came back today to provide more information?
14	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yes, that's right.
15	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Okay. What
16	information would you like to add today?
17	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Okay. I've been writing
18	down since that meeting in Sagkeeng, Pine Falls. Like,
19	Wendy told me to write down the times I have tried phoning
20	for that detective, [Detective D]. And, sometimes a lot
21	of times he does not call back. I got times and that here,
22	days.
23	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: That's all of the
24	notes that you had? Like, you took notes every time?
25	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yes.

1	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Oh, excellent.
2	MS. DOROTHY STARR: I don't know if you need
3	these, or
4	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Well, can you tell
5	us a little bit, just for the camera and the record, like,
6	how many times you tried to call him, how many times he
7	never he didn't reply?
8	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Just count your dates
9	there, mom.
10	MS. DOROTHY STARR: The dates?
11	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: The dates that you
12	called.
13	MS. DOROTHY STARR: July 7, 2015, and July
14	okay, July 3, 2017. July 25, 2017, July 27 th
15	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: There's also August
16	17 th .
17	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yes.
18	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, back here
19	somewhere. Yes, that's down, that's August 17th. It's
20	August 18th. So far, nothing even to let me know what they
21	are doing. People don't know what it feels like not
22	knowing what happened to your child. That's what I wrote
23	there. And then from there where was I?
24	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: July 7th.
25	MS. DOROTHY STARR: This was the first when

1	I started writing, July 7, 2015.
2	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Oh yeah, 2015.
3	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yes.
4	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: If you go back from
5	the year 2015 until now, you had a lot of
6	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Oh, I got a there's
7	July 25 th
8	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: (Indiscernible).
9	MS. DOROTHY STARR: July 25, July 27, July
10	29.
11	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: So, you have it
12	all from 2015?
13	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yes. That's when I
14	started keeping track.
15	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: No, 2017. She hasn't
16	kept track of all her calls prior to that, but
17	MS. DOROTHY STARR: But, that's they're
18	numerous.
19	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: So, what we can
20	do, maybe we can make a photocopy of this, and I can leave
21	you the original? And, I can make a photocopy of this, and
22	if you want the same thing, you can keep your originals.
23	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Yes.
24	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Okay, excellent.
25	And, is there anything else that you, like, that you'd like

2	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yeah, it's okay, it's
3	about
4	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Dragging the Red.
5	MS. DOROTHY STARR: dragging the Red,
6	the people that are dragging the Red River. Okay, his name
7	is [K] (phon).
8	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: [K]?
9	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yes.
10	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Oh, okay. He's the
11	leader in the dragging
12	MS. DOROTHY STARR: He was yes.
13	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: the Red River.
14	He got involved with us when we were on the search, on
15	our
16	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: On our own search.
17	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Yeah, on our own
18	search, but we approached him when we seen him. And, he
19	did help us. But, the times he worked for us, and we
20	worked with him, the police have never really been involved
21	with his findings. Even if we did have findings, they
22	wouldn't update or do any
23	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Basically, never hear
24	anything of it.
25	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yeah.

1	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, do you know
2	what kind of finding he did?
3	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: He found a skull, a
4	human skull, teeth, hair
5	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Guns.
6	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: guns.
7	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yes.
8	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Didn't he find chunks
9	of skin or something? I don't know what that stuff was he
10	found.
11	MS. DOROTHY STARR: They found quite a few
12	stuff anyways, and then they had a container they found to
13	put in there, and when the day is over, the cops would pick
14	it up, but no word after that.
15	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: It was never
16	picked up? The evidence were never picked up?
17	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Oh, they'd pick it up,
18	or
19	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: We would just never
20	hear of anything.
21	MS. DOROTHY STARR: But, you never hear one
22	word.
23	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Like, nothing in the
24	news to say, like, there is this found or, you know, just
25	nothing.

1	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, do you think
2	it's linked, this discovery is linked, with your own
3	search?
4	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Not really, because
5	[K] has been dragging the Red River for eight years
6	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yes.
7	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: nine years.
8	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Nine years.
9	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: He's been looking for
10	his sister, but never got assistance neither from the cops.
11	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: So, you see that
12	the cops are not like, are not going through the
13	findings that you had, and that they haven't been really
14	helpful with that?
15	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yeah.
16	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: I see.
17	MS. DOROTHY STARR: And, remember about
18	those bones you guys found?
19	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Yes, we found bones,
20	too, on our searches. And, we submitted them, and we asked
21	them to get them checked. We know it was a pelvic bone of
22	a human, because an animal is sideways, but a human is this
23	way. And, we found one piece on the west side of the bank,
24	and along the other side, we found east, we found a
25	piece of pelvic bone. On the west side of the bank, we

1	found cuts, pieces of all kinds of bones cut. You could
2	see it was cut with some kind of
3	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Maybe a saw or
4	something.
5	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Not a saw, it was
6	like a clean cut.
7	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Like, a chop kind of
8	look maybe. I don't know.
9	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: I don't know. It was
10	cut. It was a clean cut. We started putting pieces
11	together, but they were saying it was animal bones. I had
12	so much pictures of all these findings on my phone, but my
13	phone got damaged, so I couldn't get that information. All
14	those pieces of bone were long I don't know. They're
15	about this big. We put a measuring tape beside them, too,
16	or an object to show how big the bone was and all that.
17	But, we gathered all those bones and we gave them to
18	what was that, your first woman there. [Detective A]?
19	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Oh, the detective?
20	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Yeah, the detective.
21	MS. DOROTHY STARR: [Detective A], yeah.
22	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: She picked up those
23	bones, and she never said nothing about them after.
24	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: (Indiscernible)

1	MS. DOROTHY STARR: No.
2	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: And, I hear they're
3	trying to take [K] off the river, to stop him.
4	MS. DOROTHY STARR: They did already.
5	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Oh, they did?
6	MS. DOROTHY STARR: That's why he can't do
7	nothing this summer.
8	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: They stopped his
9	searching. They didn't let him.
10	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yeah, they didn't let
11	him go back on the river.
12	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, how did they
13	do that? They just told him, "You cannot go back?" How
14	did that happen?
15	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Well, the year before
16	last year, they were already after him that they didn't
17	want him doing dragging on the river. But, he kept on.
18	But now this Bernadette Smith turned on him, too.
19	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: She turned on him,
20	too?
21	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yes.
22	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Because she was
23	supposed to be the coordinator for him.
24	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yeah, but she turned on
25	him, too, and sided with the police, or something like

1	that. And because I talked to [K], I ran into him
2	earlier this month. He says, "I'm sorry, I can't do that.
3	I'm not allowed." And that's when he told me that
4	Bernadette turned on him from doing that, that she sided
5	with the other people to stop him from dragging the Red.
6	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: I wonder why.
7	MS. DOROTHY STARR: I don't know.
8	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, do you have
9	any I know we talked a little bit about it yesterday,
10	but do you have any feelings why the police didn't pursue
11	when you will be providing pieces of evidence, and how do
12	you feel about it?
13	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: It just kind of makes
14	you leery on trusting them, do you know what I mean? They
15	don't come off like they'd be trustworthy for anything.
16	You just well, it's hard. You're finding evidence like
17	this. Why isn't nothing being done or said; right? I
18	mean, like, it may not be our brother, but it could if
19	it's a person, it could belong to somebody's family.
20	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Somebody is looking for
21	them.
22	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: For closure somewhere
23	Because it's not just our brother that's missing. There's
24	a lot of people that go missing. We also have another
25	cousin of mine I work with; his niece has been missing for

1	the past two weeks now. So, I mean, this is happening way
2	too much. And then there's no again, with that, there
3	is no help being done there, I believe.
4	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: That was my next
5	question. Do you know about this investigation, if it's
6	getting
7	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: No. He says, as far
8	as he could tell, there's not a lot being done. So, it
9	sounds like the same kind of situation we're going through
10	I forget what he said his niece's name was. It's a hard
11	thing. I mean, it's just suffering, the family. Do you
12	know what I mean? I'm sure I fit was their family member,
13	they'd be all out looking, you know, real hard.
14	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, making all
14 15	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, making all the efforts.

2	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Weeks. It went on every
3	day.
4	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: And, I'm thinking,
5	"How come they didn't do this for Chris?" You know?
6	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: And, again, we feel
7	it's because of the racial issue.
8	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Mm-hmm.
9	MS. DOROTHY STARR: That's what it is.
10	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: So, you really
11	feel a difference
12	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Yes.
13	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: is what I am
14	understanding?
15	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Yes.
16	MS. DOROTHY STARR: And then yeah, and I
17	noticed because when I drive back home, I make a few
18	stops to see missing Native people, and they're still
19	missing. And, I've ever heard nothing about these on the
20	news, but I seen them on posters. But, that's probably
21	because of the families putting up posters, and not
22	clarifying it with the news. I'm not finding that out
23	through the news, eh? I'm finding out by posters like
24	this, homemade posters.
25	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, that's what

1	we want with this Inquiry, right, to see the pattern, and
2	how is that possible? There is a problem. So, we want to
3	see we want to make it better, and we want to see how it
4	is affecting people. And, that's why your statement is so
5	<pre>important; right?</pre>
6	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Mm-hmm.
7	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Is there anything
8	else that you know about the investigation and that you
9	would like to talk today about? Like, how it wasn't dealt
10	by the institution, police institution, or any other
11	institutions that you dealt with during your search?
12	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Oh, I think the only one
13	that was there when we were searching there was Jill, eh?
14	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Jill from the news.
15	MS. DOROTHY STARR: CBC.
16	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: She was from the news,
17	yeah. She interviewed my mom a few times, like, about the
18	incident with Chris missing.
19	MS. DOROTHY STARR: And, that's the only
20	time, a very short
21	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: A brief
22	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yes.
23	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: That he was missing,
24	but
25	MS. DOROTHY STARR: And, after that, it was

1	that one day, one evening, whatever, and that's it. You
2	don't hear nothing else.
3	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Yeah, because, like I
4	said, I don't watch the news. But, even still, I never
5	when I do see news, I don't see nothing, like, advertised
6	about missing, or you know, how it is on the news. They
7	are brief. But, not even a sign of saying, oh, like,
8	"family is looking for family members," or something, you
9	know? Like, just make a brief newscast about it. But,
10	nothing.
11	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, I see that
12	you brought, as well, a picture.
13	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Yeah, that's Chris
14	there. This is the one that we posted. We put them all
15	over the streets, and they all got ripped off.
16	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: That's what you
17	were referring to yesterday, when you said they all
18	were
19	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Yeah. Posted them up
20	everywhere. Every pole. But, every pole they're gone.
21	So, maybe it was striking a nerve to somebody who couldn't
22	stand to see his face anymore, maybe. Yeah, I don't know.
23	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: There's guilt there,
24	or something, or something is known.
25	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, can we keep

1	this for our archives or you would like that we make a
2	photocopy?
3	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: We'd prefer to keep
4	the colour copy. If you could make a photocopy?
5	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Of course. Of
6	course. So, I will make a photocopy of
7	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: It's our only colour
8	copy we have of this picture right now.
9	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Okay, excellent.
10	So, I will make a photocopy of it.
11	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Okay.
12	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Thank you so much
13	for sharing this information. And, I think it's really
14	nice that we can see Chris as well. So, for us
15	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Yeah. Well, it's
16	important because he's not just a name.
17	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Exactly. So, it's
18	important for us to have a picture as well.
19	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Exactly.
20	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: So, thank you for
21	bringing this today. I think it's important.
22	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Yes.
23	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, I was
24	wondering if there is anything else that you would like to
25	discuss today, about all the things that we've been talking

1	yesterday? So, if you have anything else that you would
2	like to add? I'm here for you, and we can take all the
3	time that you need. So, if you have thought yesterday
4	between well, between today and yesterday about
5	something else that you would like to talk about, we're
6	here for you.
7	MS. DOROTHY STARR: (Indiscernible) I forgot
8	about that I was writing down, and about dragging the Red.
9	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: And, also, like, if
10	I'm leaving today if I come back, like, tomorrow evening,
11	come back for Thursday, I'm thinking of bringing that
12	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Map.
13	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: We had a map of the
14	city where I was highlighting where we were searching all
15	over areas. If I could bring that in, maybe you could take
16	a photocopy of it or something?
17	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Yes. That could
18	totally, we can do that.
19	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Okay. I'll bring
20	that stuff back on Thursday.
21	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, I think what
22	would be the most yeah, I think the most efficient thing
23	is maybe I can provide you my cell phone. It's just I
24	don't know if I will be in the hearings. I don't know what
25	will be the best.

1	MS. LISA HARTWICK: Me as well. You know
2	how we went to that table at the back, there was the front
3	registration desk, and then we went to talk to, I think it
4	was Michelle at the back? That would probably be if
5	we're not available, to talk with her. She would be able
6	to get the photocopy and get it to the statement. Okay?
7	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Okay.
8	MS. LISA HARTWICK: I'm sure they'll let us
9	know. Now they know you a little, they know us in relation
10	to you.
11	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: That could work.
12	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Okay. Excellent.
13	Yes.
14	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Those were the main
15	things I forgot yesterday.
16	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Like I said, each day
17	your head clears, and you remember something else. You may
18	remember something tonight again when you go home. Just
19	like yesterday, everything started coming back, like,
20	things we could have said. But, this is and tomorrow
21	we'll come back. You've just got to let your mind clear.
22	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Also, if I remember
23	certain things, I will write them down.
24	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Yes. And then you
25	can submit them. If you can't see them, they will see what

1	you wrote, or that you want to say.
2	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Yes. And, we are
3	here until Friday. So, if there is anything else that
4	comes back that you would like to share with us, we are
5	here. And, after that, when we're gone, I won't be in
6	Winnipeg, but we have staff in Winnipeg. So, it's possible
7	to be in contact with them as well. So, they will be here.
8	We won't be in the Radisson, but I think they will be able
9	to have contact with you and be able to meet with you as
10	well.
11	MS. LISA HARTWICK: There should definitely
12	be somebody following up from the team. Like, not just me,
13	but somebody. They mentioned it this morning in our
14	meeting that there's a follow up aftercare. So
15	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Okay.
16	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, if you have
17	any other questions, anything you would like I know we
18	will go do photocopy, but anything that you would like to,
19	again, share about something else, or that you have been
20	thinking that you would like to share? Or, that was it for
21	today?
22	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Those were the things I
23	forgot about yesterday.
24	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: What about that thing
25	you mentioned downstairs, what they did to him?

1	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Oh, okay. I was still
2	living I was on Manitoba Avenue at the time. That's
3	quite a while back. There was one day that, I guess, Chris
4	was talking to his Uncle Cliff is that the one you're
5	talking about?
6	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: I think so.
7	MS. DOROTHY STARR: About the water?
8	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: Yeah, about the
9	water.
10	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yeah. Apparently, the
11	cops beat him up, so he had to pretend to be knocked out.
12	And, when they thought he was knocked out, they threw him
13	in the river.
14	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Do you know who
15	did that?
16	MS. DOROTHY STARR: The police.
17	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: He didn't know which
18	badge number, because he didn't
19	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Oh, this is
20	terrible.
21	MS. JENNIFER GUIMOND: I'm just hearing
22	about that, like, myself, too. Like, she stays out here
23	with them, I'm back home, eh?
24	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: There are times he
25	would come home, like if he got picked up somewhere like

I said, he had an addiction problem before. Once in a 1 while he would get picked up by the police. And then he'd 2 3 later come back ---MS. DOROTHY STARR: All bruised. 4 MS. STEPHANIE STARR: --- bruised, like he 5 So, I mean, like, I think there is a lot of 6 got beaten. 7 unfair treatment and unnecessary treatment. MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, in your 8 9 opinion, this happened many times? 10 MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Yes, more than just 11 one occasion. MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yeah. Oh yeah. 12 MS. STEPHANIE STARR: And, at the hands of 13 14 the police. MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, is there any 15 16 -- has he ever went to the police? MS. STEPHANIE STARR: No, he just left it 17 alone. He didn't want to take it on. Just, like, take the 18 19 hits, and then just let it go. MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yeah, because he knows 20 he wouldn't get nowhere. 21 22 MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Exactly. Exactly. So, that's what it felt like. Like, he would be cornered 23 and then, you know, there would be no justice for him; 24 25 right? Because you're fighting against the justice. So, I

1	mean but, that's been more than one occasion, for sure,
2	where they beat him down.
3	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, do you know
4	if this happened a long time before April 7, 2015?
5	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Oh yeah. Oh yeah. It
6	was on and off that it would happen.
7	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: On and off? So,
8	do you have any memories of that happening before April 7,
9	2015?
10	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Just that he'd come
11	back bruised or something, or just really sore. But, he
12	wouldn't like show his back for bruises or anything, but
13	you would know he's not moving like he should be.
14	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: So, you
15	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: That's, again, it's
16	stuff like that, that just makes you not want to trust the
17	police here. You lose faith in stuff like that, so it
18	makes it hard. And, it makes it hard for us to ask for
19	help from them and expect the help because of these
20	situations.
21	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: I just maybe have
22	more questions. So, you mentioned that that would happen,
23	and it happened not so long before he went missing?
24	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yeah.
25	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: It would have been

1	long before that even. Like, occasionally he would take a
2	beating.
3	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Do you remember
4	the last time it happened? Do you have a
5	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Not a specific day,
6	no, no. Again, something like that, I didn't keep track
7	of, like, the days or things that would happen. But, yeah
8	it just shouldn't have happened.
9	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: No, it shouldn't
10	have happened. Like, violence is
11	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Something like that,
12	no. Like, they're supposed to be there to help
13	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Exactly.
14	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: not hurt.
15	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: This shouldn't
16	have happened. I'm sorry to hear that, because it is hard
17	to lose trust in an institution.
18	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: And, I guarantee he's
19	not the only one that something like that has happened to.
20	It's not the first.
21	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, that's what
22	we are looking into as well. So, it's important to have
23	this information.
24	MS. DOROTHY STARR: And, I think, my other

daughter, she was waiting for a bus on Fourth and

1	(Indiscernible) to go down to (Indiscernible), but she was
2	on her cell phone. And, at the bus stop, there was a
3	Native guy there, and two cops showed up. I guess somebody
4	phoned and complained about him. They just started beating
5	him up. And, I guess one of the cops thought that Bobbie
6	was taking pictures of that, but her bus came, and that cop
7	was going towards her. But, she jumped on the bus. A lot
8	of stuff like that that goes on.
9	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, again, that's
10	what we're trying because this is not acceptable, so
11	that's why we're trying to see what's going on, and what we
12	can do to make the future better; right? That's the idea.
13	But, we are hearing that there are many problems
14	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: They're yeah,
15	definitely there are issues.
16	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: there are
17	issues, and it didn't happen only once. I think that we've
18	been hearing that since yesterday. So, I think it's really
19	important that you're sharing that with us as well.
20	MS. DOROTHY STARR: Yes. Yeah, I don't
21	believe in them anymore.
22	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Sorry?
23	MS. DOROTHY STARR: I said, I don't believe
24	in them anymore at all. Just no faith in them.
25	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: I understand. So,

1	if there is anything, again, that you would like to share,
2	let us know. We are there. But, if it's what you wanted
3	to share with us today, well, thank you so much. And, I
4	will make a photocopy, if it's okay with you. You can go
5	downstairs with Lisa. I will go make some photocopies and
6	give you back the originals.
7	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Okay. Yes, because we
8	would like to keep our own records.
9	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: Of course. Of
10	course. And, for us, it's really useful to have this
11	information.
12	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Of course, yes.
13	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: And, again, to see
14	Chris, what he looks like, and have a picture of him. So,
15	yes, okay. Excellent. So, if it's all right with you, and
16	if you don't have any other questions, I will turn off the
17	record, and we will be able to make the photocopies, and
18	you can just stay with Lisa.
19	MS. STEPHANIE STARR: Okay. Thanks, again.
20	MS. MARIE AUDREY GIRARD: So, this is Marie
21	Audrey. We will go off record. It is 12:17.
