Victims of Violence Policy

If you are living in an abusive situation, and are seeking safe affordable housing, Newfoundland and Labrador Housing Corporation (NLHC) may be able to assist you. Through our Victims of Violence Policy:

- We assist victims of violence when applying for housing or seeking a transfer within NLHC;
- An applicant may apply for housing if they are in an abusive home situation, seek temporary refuge with friends or relatives, or move to an emergency shelter;
- Applicants are assigned a Social Worker to help them through the process, answer their questions and can refer them to any counseling they may require;
- All applications are kept strictly confidential.
