## The National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls will be in Halifax, Nova Scotia

To all families and survivors in Nova Scotia:

<u>The National Inquiry will have a team consisting of community relations,</u> <u>legal and health in Halifax, the week of August 14, 2017</u>. The teams will be reaching out to individuals and families in Halifax who are willing to participate in the National Inquiry.

The community visit is an opportunity for families and survivors to register to participate in the Inquiry and prepare for the Community Hearing which will take place in Halifax, the week of October 30, 2017.

The Commissioners' mandate is to examine and report on the systemic causes of all forms of violence against Indigenous women and girls in Canada by looking at patterns and underlying factors.
