

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The following document summarizes the quarterly reports between 2015 and 2017 that were submitted to the Winnipeg Police Board on the Winnipeg Police Service's Indigenous Women Safety and Protection Strategy.

In December 2014, the Winnipeg Police Board provided direction to the Chief of Police to provide a status report on the Police Service's current activities with respect to solving cases of missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls.

In June 2015, the 2015 - 2019 Strategic Plan was released. The Strategic Plan called for the development of a strategy that would include giving quarterly updates to the Winnipeg Police Board on the Service's activities to solve cases of missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls and end violence against Indigenous women and girls. To that end, the Winnipeg Police Service developed an Indigenous Women – Safety and Protection report. The report provides updates to the board in the following areas:

- 1. Investigations
- 2. Enforcement
  - Prevention/Intervention
- 4. Community Engagement
- 5. Research

Between 2015 and end of year 2017 there have been 12 quarterly reports submitted to the board. The following represents a chronological examination by topic area.

In addition, the Winnipeg Police Counter Exploitation Unit conducts investigations that target offenders involved in the exploitation of vulnerable persons, which may include indigenous women. These investigative units are supported by the Winnipeg Police Crime Analysis Unit.

All of the investigative efforts engaged in by these units support the Strategic Plan – Goal 1 Less Crime and Victimization.

#### 2. ENFORCEMENT:

Consistently in the third quarter, the CEU has more arrests. This is most likely as a result of counter exploitation projects that are run in the third quarter. DISC events are also highest in the third quarter. It may be beneficial to run projects at varying times of the year and not only in the third quarter.

Prior to 2017, the WPS has an eight member unit dedicated to counter exploitation. The strategic direction of this unit was to focus suppression and enforcement efforts on offenders who exploit women and youths; and to focus prevention and intervention efforts on those being exploited. This enforcement activity included street level prostitution, massage parlors involved in prostitution, and prostitution activity facilitated by the Internet.

In 2017 the CEU and MPU amalgamated to form one unit.

		<ul> <li>Proactive Strategy Initiated - In Q3 the CEU began a pro-active strategy designed to deter sex trade consumers prior to being arrested by the Unit, and indeed in many cases prior to having any contact with Police. The CEU often receives information from the community regarding sexual exploitation of women in the community at the street level. In the past this information had been recorded as intelligence, but it was rarely acted upon. The Counter Exploitation Unit is assigned to pro-actively initiate contact with persons suspected of being involved in sexual exploitation activity. During police contact they are</li> </ul>
		advised of the new laws governing sexual exploitation and the consequences associated to sexual exploitation.
