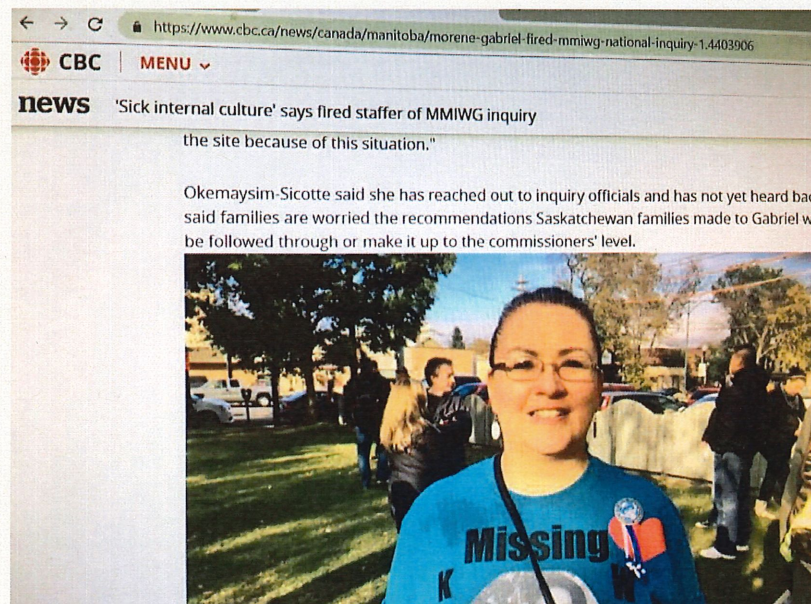
Measuring Change in the Media

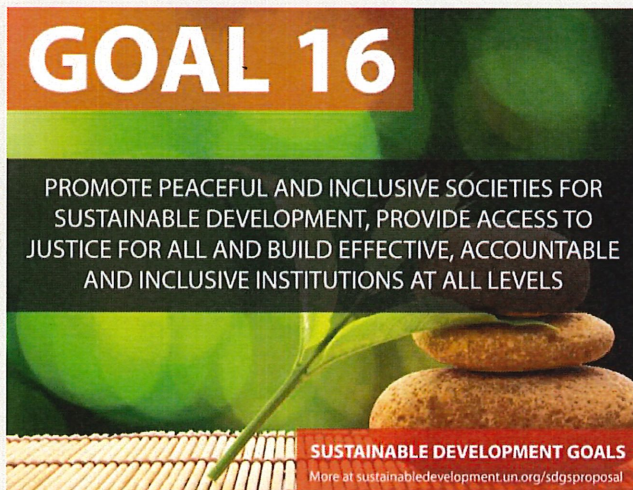




Sustainable Development Goals – National Implementation Strategy

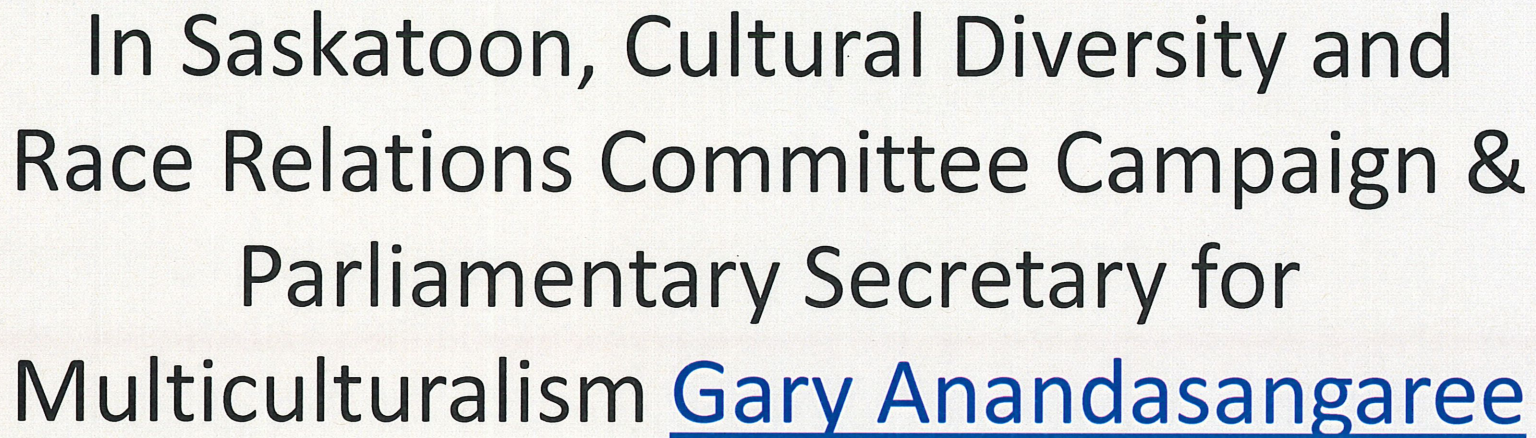

Anti-Racism – National Strategy

- The federal government through the Department of Canadian Heritage working to create an anti-racism strategy. Through online survey and holding local consultations with different communities across the country
- Focusing on three topics: **Justice, Employment, and Social Services** all part of the MMIWG2S experience
- Canadian consultation population reflections in the wide diversity of ethnicities, cultures, and religions with people from approximately 200 ethnic groups





MMIWG2S – Health After Care & FILU

- On June 5th, 2018, the Government of Canada announced it would assist the National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls (MMIWG) and provide mental health support services to survivors, family members and those affected by the issue of MMIWG from now until June 30, 2020
- Family Information Liaison Unit (FILU) can help you find out information and provide support, FILU is a unit of the Department of Justice's Victim Services branch

- ▶ In order to be eligible for payment you must be currently enrolled as a provider under either the NIHB Program or the IRS RHSP prior to providing any services to clients.
- ▶ Incomplete forms will be returned unprocessed.
- ▶ Please note that the initial client session(s) assessment (up to two hours) do not require prior approval.
- ▶ This form is to be completed for prior approval for counselling to be covered through either the Non-Insured Health Benefits Program (NIHB) or the Indian Residential Schools Resolution Health Support Program (IRS RHSP).
- ▶ To be eligible for payment, counselling services must be provided in accordance with the terms and conditions in the Guide to Mental Health Counselling Services - NIHB and IRS RHSP (Guide).
- ▶ Counselling would normally be expected to start within 10 business days following the prior approval.

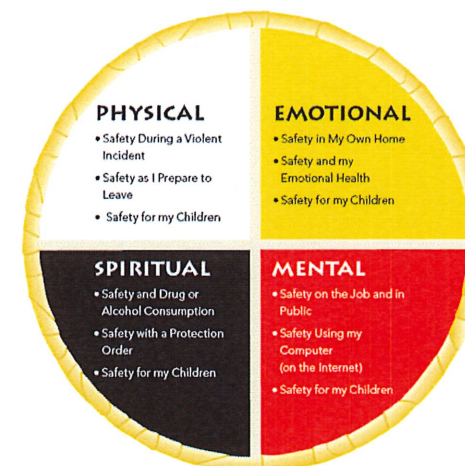
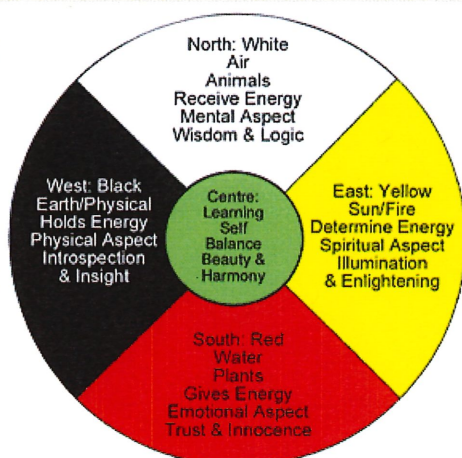

- A national plan to have MMIWG2S searches be part of Emergency Preparedness Plans, policies, legislation

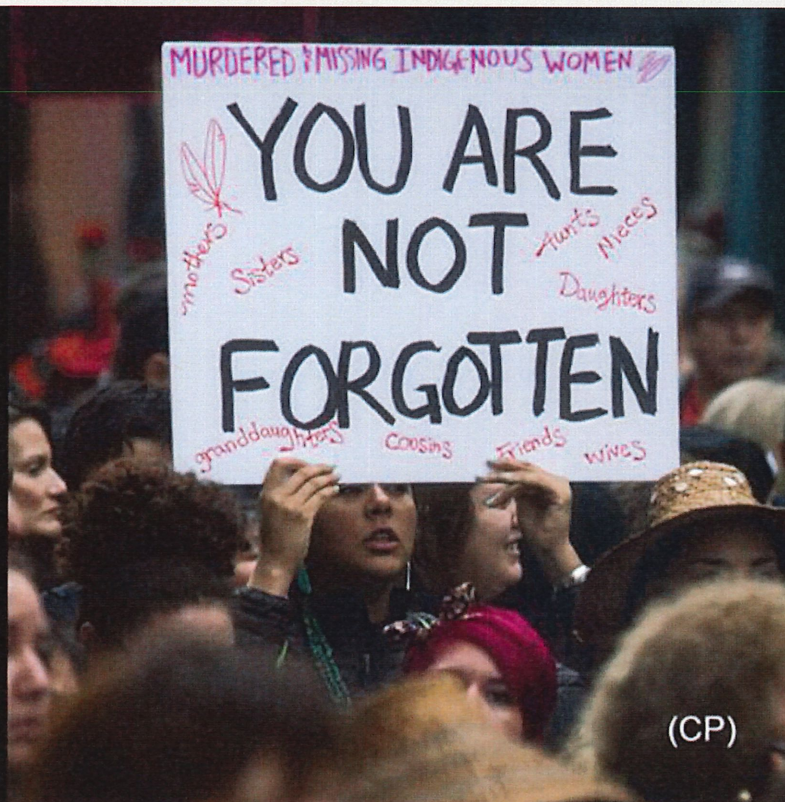

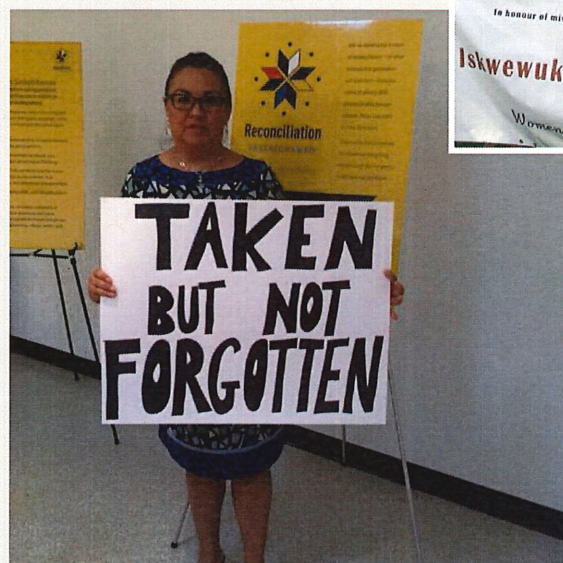

Missing Indigenous Person's National Fund

- Government to change or create fund for parents and families of murdered, missing children, youth, adults of Indigenous Persons in Canada
- federal ombudsman for victims of crime, found the program's eligibility criteria is found to be so narrow that even those families who clearly ought to qualify may not receive financial help

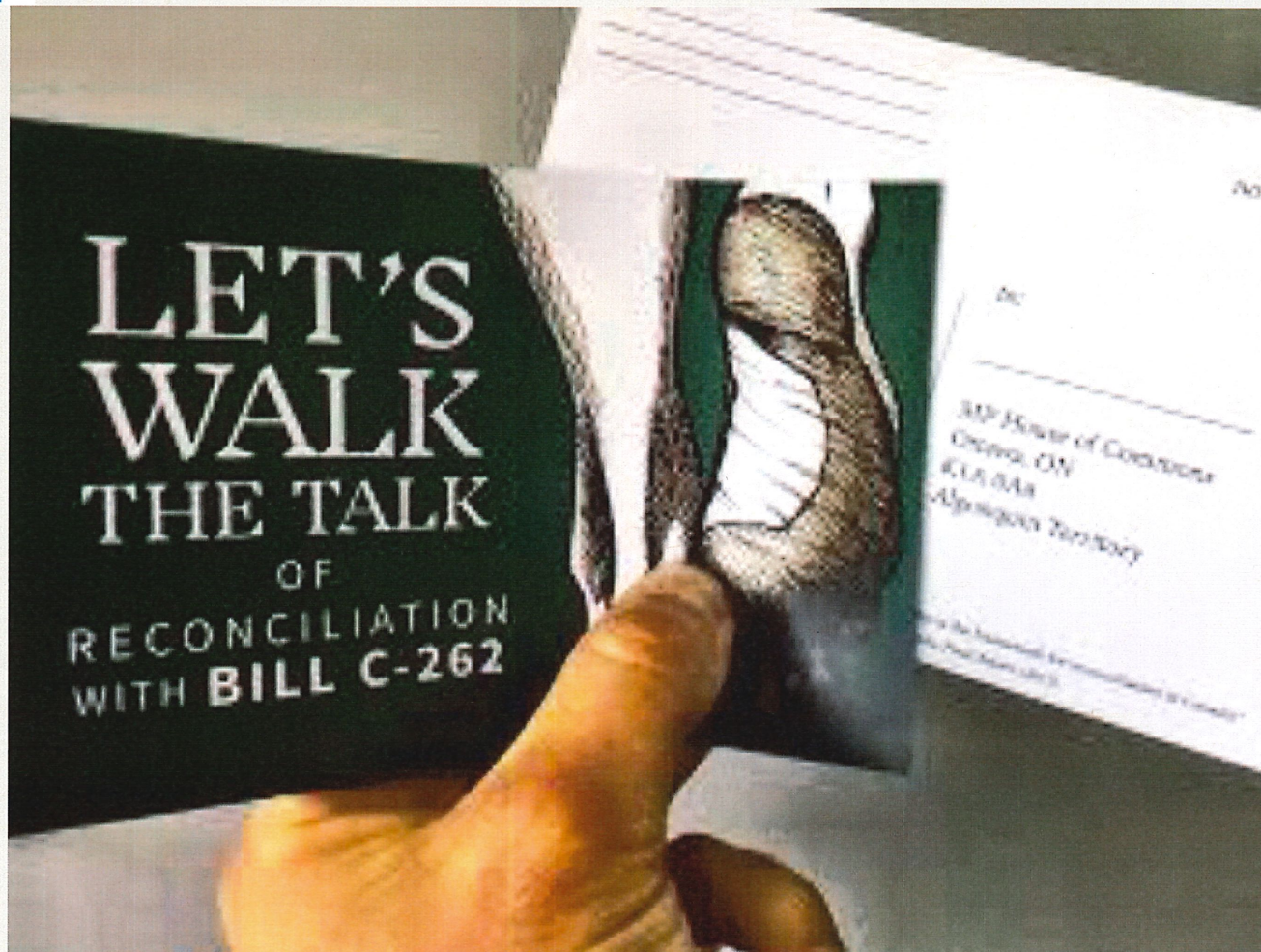


Bills C-215 and Bill C-262 UNDRIP

- Bill C-215 An Act to amend the Criminal Code (sentencing for violent offences against Aboriginal women)
- Introduced by Senator Lillian E. Dyck
- A private member's bill aimed at ensuring Canada's laws are in harmony with the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples has earned the approval of the House of Commons.
- Bill C-262, introduced by New Democrat MP and reconciliation critic Romeo Saganash
