Assistant Commissioner (A/Commr.) Crampton joined the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) in 1988. She began her career in Surrey, British Columbia, later transferring to various communities in Alberta and Saskatchewan. During this time she gained experience in the area of Drugs, Intelligence, Covert Operations and Front Line Policing in Aboriginal, Municipal and Rural Communities. In addition, she was also an Instructor at the RCMP Training Academy in Regina, SK and worked in Corporate Planning.

In 2008 she received her Commission to Halifax, Nova Scotia as the Executive Officer for the Commanding Officer. She later transferred to Halifax District as the Officer in Charge of Operations where she supervised multiple units including Uniform Front Line Patrol, the Halifax International Airport and a Street Crime Enforcement Unit. In 2011, A/Commr. Crampton transferred to the position of Divisional Intelligence Officer where she was responsible for managing the RCMP Intelligence Program in Nova Scotia as well as support units such as National Security, Technological Crime, Covert Operations and a Combined Forces Intelligence Unit.

A/Commr. Crampton transferred to Prince Edward Island (PEI) in 2013 as the Officer in Charge of Criminal Operations where she was responsible for overseeing Contract, Federal and Protective Policing for the province. She was later appointed as the Commanding Officer for PEI from 2015 to 2017. A/Commr. Crampton is now posted to Ottawa where she is currently in charge of Federal Policing Criminal Operations responsible for Serious and Organized Crime, Financial Crime, Border Integrity, Human Trafficking and Cyber Crime at a National and International level.

A/Commr. Crampton has a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from Acadia University in Wolfville, Nova Scotia, graduating in 1988 with Honours and has attended the Harvard Kennedy School of Executive Education. She has received the RCMP Long Service and Good Conduct Medal, a Commanding Officer's Commendation and in 2015 was appointed as a Member of the Order of Merit of the Police Officers. Prior to her departure from PEI, she was awarded an Eagle Feather from the Aboriginal Communities for developing a Relationship Building Protocol and for her leadership, open communication and dedication to culturally sensitive policing.
