

Evaluating Search Urgency

Instructions

- To be used (as a guide) to determine the urgency of a search and if a ground search is required; as the figures are only relative. unlisted factors can also be considered and should be noted in the "Comment" field
- 2. All 7 factors shall only be scored once and independently of one another
- "Urgency Scores" are allotted based upon the following: 3.
 - 1 = Most urgent/Life threatening (immediate response required)
 - 2 = Urgent (measured response)
 - 3 = Less urgent (more investigation necessary)
- 4. If any Contributing Factor is "life threatening", treat search as rating of 1 (most urgent)
- 5. "Urgency Score" is determined by adding (+) individual scores of all Contributing Factors, and dividing (÷) by the number of factors (7)
