### **CBC Massey Lecturer for 2018**

The Massey Lectures, named after Vincent Massey, former governor general of Canada, are a partnership between the CBC, House of Anansi Press and Massey College in the University of Toronto. Talaga will give lectures on Indigenous youth suicide in five Canadian cities this fall and the lectures will result in a book and a national radio series on CBC.
